At once the Spirit sent Jesus out into the wilderness, and he was in the wilderness forty days, being tempted by Satan. He was with the wild animals, and angels attended him. Mark 1:12-13

LENT

Today marks the first Sunday of the ancient church season of Lent. There is something special about travelling a journey that millions before us have travelled down the centuries. We are part of a great story and community that have contemplated and entered in to the journey of Christ and his 40 days in the wilderness. It's quite a thought to ponder as we begin our own journeys.

It is worth noting that the three great practices of Lent—*prayer, fasting, and almsgiving* (an act of giving to others) — are three things you **do**. At the heart of the Lent season, is a recognition that these practices of 'doing' as Christ did in His life, lead us into a deeper relationship with Christ. For this momentous Christian season, we will be exploring the great biblical theme of EXILE. Today **Gareth** will set the scene and explore what it means for us to **'come home' and 'belong'**.
