## REFLECTIONS FROM THE CO-VICARS

This week is the last in our current sermon series “Who are You?”, before the season of Lent begins. Today, Josh will reflect on the telling question Jesus asks of all His disciples, including all of us - “Why are you so afraid?”

### LENT - EXILE

Next week, we begin the very important journey of Lent, which has been part of the church tradition for centuries. We are very excited that our theme for this spiritual journey of self-examination, will be exploring the biblical concept of **EXILE**, a theme that runs throughout the whole of Scripture.

### 2020 VISION

Over these next two weeks, we’re going to be weaving into these themes our hopes, aspirations and vision for 2020 and beyond. Last year, was a huge one for this community in Christ with many exciting fruits of the Kingdom being borne in all areas of ministry and mission. How we continue to build on this work will require a continued collaboration of all our time and talents under the direction of the Holy Spirit.
