## REFLECTIONS FROM JOSH

We come to the final week of our six-week series "**Christ in Uncertain Times**" and from the feedback we've received, it's been a hugely rewarding series. Many of you have commented on the reminder it's given for two important aspects for our faith journey. Firstly, the rich and deep wisdom that is contained in these encounters with Jesus, that bring restoration and transformation. Secondly, just how important these time honoured Christian Spiritual practices that we've explored in the series, actually are for our daily formation and spiritual well-being in Christ.

Today we welcome our very own Lynette Eaton, who is a core and inspirational part of our Children and Families Team. Alongside this, Lynette's main occupation is in the Neo Natal and Paediatric Intensive Care Units at Starship Children's Hospital, here in Auckland. Which means that Lynette's work often encompasses very difficult and sometimes heart-breaking situations.

It's from the reality of this experience that Lynette will explore the challenge we all come across in life, of finding hope in the 'tears of things', in our sufferings. **LAMENT** is part of our human condition that's woven into the fabric of our biblical tradition, especially in the Psalms. It's when we cry out "why Lord?" and don't appear to be getting an answer. Think of lines such as "*Why do you hide yourself from me in times of trouble Lord?*", "*How long, O Lord?*" and of course, Jesus own cry of lament on the Cross, "*My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?*" from Psalm 22. It's an aspect of our Christian spirituality that hasn't always been fully understood and at times neglected. Lynette will also share her own experience of the ancient Christian practice of Journaling, and how this can help us to express our own feelings of lament and to recognise God's presence in the fog of our own anguish, so we look forward to hearing from Lynette today.
