

## REFLECTIONS FROM JOSH JONES

TODAY we begin our Sermon series for January in which we savour and explore The Psalms. These ancient Hebrew poems were most often sung as hymns and their real richness and beauty is that they express the full range of our human condition. The Psalms give us a worldview, a way of communing with God and knowing him more intimately. We receive a map by which we can understand the contours and direction of our lives. If I had to capture their essence in two words I would say 'honest humanity'. We can only realise the fullness of a mature authentic spirituality if we are able to express the authentic fullness of our human condition. I would like to think that this ethos of encouraging a honest authentic humanity, is a core heartbeat for who we are and what we value as a St George's community in Christ. A few months back we shared these words with our Staff and Vestry team, and they are words worth consistently returning too, as a reminder of what it looks like to reflect the spirit of the Psalms.

If this is not a place where tears are understood,  
where do I go to cry?

If this is not a place where my spirits can take wing,  
where do I go to fly?

If this is not a place where my questions can be asked,  
where do I go to seek?

If this is not a place where my feelings can be heard,  
where do I go to speak?

If this is not a place you'll accept me as I am,  
where do I go to be me?

The next St. George's Marriage Preparation Course starts


**Wednesday, 27th January 2021**
