Northern Bound Pilgrimage

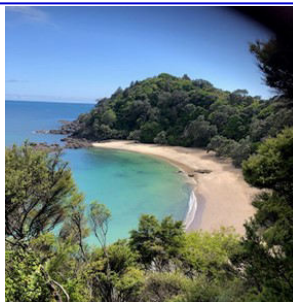
Matapouri to Whananaki

REFLECTIONS FROM JOSH JONES

WELCOME BACK to being a gathered worshipping community in Christ. Many of us have found the latest interruptions to our church life to be particularly frustrating, missing the heartbeat of coming together to sing, pray, hear God's word and celebrate Communion as the body of Christ. Today we welcome once again Jeremy Woods, our placement from St John's Theological College. Jeremy will be exploring the core spiritual practice of Confession as part of our Lenten journey to the Cross.

"The point is this: the one who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and the one who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully." 2 Corinthians 9:6

I'm writing this the morning after our AGM, in which we do the important business of electing the Vestry (governing body) and agreeing the budget for 2021. I began the meeting with a devotion and the above words from St Paul because for me, they capture the spiritual wisdom at the heart of all our mission endeavours. If we want to reap abundantly, we need to sow abundantly. Be it in the areas of maintenance or ministry, now is the time for bold investment so that we continue to reap the fruits of Christ across our whole church community. **'Our vision, for God's mission, should be as big as the God we serve.'**

It's very pleasing to report that all the people up for election onto Vestry received 100% of the vote, which for me is a strong affirmation and recognition of their integrity and commitment to our community. Having been part of a Vestry continuously for 19 years, I am very aware of just how crucial it is to serve alongside people who have a shared vision and spirit of collaboration.

Vestry now has 11 members, they are; Josh Jones, Vicar - Bryan Parry, Vicar's Warden - Steve Barnett, People's Warden – **2 Synod Rep's** - Liz Fairgray & John Griffith, plus Tim Mangold, Treasurer – Karyn Bycroft - Mithun Unni – Glen Candy, Secretary – Kate Hunt – and new member Rob McMurray.

We would value your prayers for all these people who will serve our community and for all our vision aspirations for God's mission purposes. Once again, let the deep wisdom of St Paul and these words be our community prayer to inspire and guide all our endeavours ...
