## Northern Bound Pilgrimage

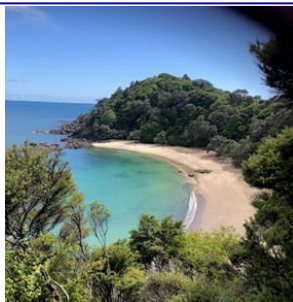
### Matapouri to Whananaki

## REFLECTIONS FROM JOSH JONES

Today we are especially delighted to welcome our Mission partner to Zambia, Dee Jones. Many of you will know Dee, who is a long-time member of our community, and some of you will not as she returns to NZ every couple of years for a well-earned sabbatical. Hearing from Dee is always an inspiring and challenging joy, so we look forward to Dee's contribution to our Lent season and journey to the foot of the Cross.

**Lent Re-Cap** - Given the interrupted nature of our Lent series, we thought it might be helpful to capture some of the core area's covered, as we've entered this Lenten time of self-examination through grace.

On **Ash Wednesday** I began the journey with King David's great Ash Wednesday prayer ... "**Create in me a clean heart O God**". Lent is a time to allow the Spirit to 'search much deeper within' so that we can deepen the meaning and the value of our Christian lives. Cleanse me, to restore me O God. We fast, in order, to understand more fully the value of the feast.

**Week 1 - Rev Lyndon Drake, Archdeacon of Tāmaki Makaurau**, painted a picture of repentance, of what it looks like to turn from sin and find reconciliation with God and others through stories of repentance and reconciliation in this land.

**Week 2** - My turn to explore how Jesus' teaching, life and death holds up a mirror to us and invites us to truly know ourselves for a Christ-shaped life. In the spirit of humility "look with sober judgement" to see more clearly the logs in our own eyes and allow the power of prayer to begin changing us from the inside out.

**Week 3 - Steph** explored Jesus' anger at the injustices at the Temple, giving us a window into the nature of God. It was both a challenge and an invitation to face the consequences of our own actions (or inactions) head-on, but also how the consequences of Jesus' actions on the cross invite us into a deep and complete forgiveness, while also challenging our sense of comfortable acceptance of the things that anger Jesus.

**Last week, Jeremy** explored the nature of 'sin' and the core spiritual practice of 'confession' as a doorway to healing. A reminder that in both Hebrew and Greek the word for sin often carries a sense of '**missing the mark**' of God's way and truth as revealed in Christ. Jeremy also gave us the insightful and helpful quote from Cornelius Platinga: "**sin is a culpable disturbance of shalom** (peace, wholeness, wellbeing) and a resistance to divine restoration of that harmony." A disruption between us and God, each other, creation and also within ourselves. The practice of confession, especially within a safe and trusted relationship, is a powerful way to bring something into the light and begin the process of healing.
