REFLECTIONS FROM JOSH JONES

After the risen Jesus greeted his fearful disciples with the words "Shalom/Peace be with you", he showed them the wounds on his hands and side.

A number of people commented to me after my sermon last week on the power of these words from John's Gospel. The risen Christ shows the very friends who deserted him, the wounds inflicted by human hands. And yet his first words to them is to announce God's peace, shalom and wholeness. Christ stands **alongside all of us in solidarity** with our wounds, with the offer of peace.

One of the real gifts of being a community in Christ is that we walk together as a community of wounded healers. Encouraging and sustaining each other as we follow and live out the way and the truth of the wounded but resurrected Christ.

It is crucially important to us as a leadership team, that all our ministry endeavours create and nurture a safe place of grace where we can all come 'just as we are'. We can all come carrying the scars of our traumas, our hurts, hidden secrets, painful losses and our unresolved grief. But know that we carry them with the Risen Christ standing among us.

LIFE GROUPS

A huge part of enabling this spirit of nurture and encouragement takes place in the heartbeat of our **Life Groups**. A life group is any small group of people who meet regularly from our St George's family and support each other in our faith and life walk. At the present time, we have 13 active groups. Each group has its own particular 'flavour' and way of meeting, but they are an excellent way of finding a sense of belonging and support. Finding the right group for you is part of our ministry role as we are all different personalities, with different needs at different times.
