Text for today's reflection

Anglican poet-priest Malcolm Guite writes: Sometimes known as 'doubting' Thomas, but maybe honest Thomas, courageous Thomas, even Tenacious Thomas would be nearer the mark! I thank God for St. Thomas, the one disciple who had the courage to say what everyone else was thinking but didn't dare say, the courage to ask the awkward questions that drew from Jesus some of the most beautiful and profoundly comforting of all his sayings. "We don't know where you're going, how can we know the way"? asked Thomas, and because he had the courage to confess his ignorance, we were given that beautiful saying "I am the way the Truth and the Life."

"We do not know... how can we know the way?"

Courageous master of the awkward question,
You spoke the words the others dared not say
And cut through their evasion and abstraction.

Oh doubting Thomas, father of my faith,
You put your finger on the nub of things
