


Books


Here are some books that are helpful for thinking about a Christian response to our current digital moment.


- Analog Christian by Jay Kim—This one goes through the fruit of the Spirit like our series which I discovered after we had begun! Kim pastors in Silicon Valley.
- *Digital Liturgies* by Samuel James—An exploration about the way assumptions of our digital world are shaping us.
- The Tech-Wise Family by Andy Crouch—A practical guide for parents navigating technology in the home)
- *Fully Alive* by Elizabeth Oldfield—Not about technology but ties in to the question about fully-aliveness we have been exploring. Oldfield uses the "deadly sins" as a framework.



- The Anxious Generation by Jonathan Haidt—Well researched book on the impact of smartphones and social media on us all, but especially on youth and children.
- **Stolen Focus** by Johann Hari—Looks at all the ways modern life is eroding our mental capacities to focus.
- Anything from Cal Newport (Slow Productivity, Deep Work, Digital Minimalism). Newport provides practical ways to limit technologies impact on our work and productivity for knowledge workers.

They are active in calling for safety measures and alignment in AI and their interviews with people in the field are always thoughtful.
