#### **Reflection from Rev Jeremy Woods**

Good morning, welcome to St George's! It is so good to be able to gather with you in worship today.

This morning we have **Lukas Thielmann** preaching from the lectionary exploring **the call of St Matthew.** In Matthew 9 we read of Jesus going around and calling the "tax collectors and sinners" to follow him. He sits and eats with them, the people you're not meant to be seen with. The other. The unclean. The unrighteous. This is the way of Jesus—to transgress the boundaries that we put up, to extend and receive **hospitality.** This is the shape of Jesus' missional discipleship: sitting and eating and getting to know people you normally wouldn't. Jesus gathered a group of young men around him all of different backgrounds. Matthew the tax collector would have likely been hated and despised (at least initially) by his fellow disciples.

This is a timely message given the current cultural and political polarisation driven by social media, click bait news, and "conflict entrepreneurs," a term I heard this week for those benefit from radicalising and dividing us. In this context, we the Church are called to be a unified people who gather and open our hearts and lives to one another across all sorts of boundaries of: culture/language, age, socio-economic, political viewpoints, preferences of worship styles, and so on.

This week this community has seen two beautiful expressions of this. Firstly, the **men's** retreat last weekend, with over 30 men, half of whom were under the age of 21, going deep together and learning from one another. The second was the women's couch conversations, with over 40 women gathering around tables to share about faith through life's ups and downs. Let us continue being a community that is open to the gift of each other.
