VISITORS ... It’s great to have you worshipping with us today. We hope you feel at home, and please join us in hall after service for morning tea.

Reflection from Josh

Today we come to the final week of our sermon series exploring the deeper drivers of our human capacity for Pride, Greed, Envy, Acedia (Sloth), Gluttony, Lust and today Jeremy unpacking our Anger and Wrath.

As we've said throughout the series, we believe this is has been an important theme for us to explore. The authenticity of our spiritual formation in Christ is all about allowing the Spirit to search our hearts to reveal the places that need the healing grace of God.

As we finish this series I thought it might be helpful to remind ourselves of how we began the series. We set the scene with the core foundational truths of our faith given by scripture.

That we are created in the image of the Triune God to be the image bearers of God's nature and character in the world.

We experience true 'aliveness' in our spirit and human flourishing when we are in a right and harmonious relationship with God's intended desire for his created order (**Shalom**). A sacred relationship with God, each other, nature and ourselves.

Our 'sin' is any of our human inclinations that work against the grain of God's desire for sacred relationship and diminishes our capacity to live the fullness of life Jesus offers.

In scripture there are three main expressions used to describe the nature of our sin.

The primary Greek word for sin in the New Testament is *hamartia*. Meaning **"to miss the mark"**. To miss the mark of intended shalom.

Paraptoma translating as **'trespass'**. To lose one's footing and make a **'false step'** leading to a deviation from the rightly ordered path.

Parabasis translating as **"transgression."** Meaning to **'step over a line'**. **A violation of a known sacred boundary.**

We hope that this series has been a helpful exploration for you as it has been for us.
